6 Steps to Excellent Essay Response Writing

- 1. Read the essay question twice.
- 2. <u>Identify and mark</u> (underline, circle, etc.) <u>what the essay is asking for you to answer</u> the main problems or questions.
- 3. Restate the question(s) in an introductory sentence. For example, if the question is; identify three reasons rain forests are disappearing and give examples of each, your introductory sentence could look like this: Three main reasons for the disappearance of rain forests include changing climates, pollution, and deforestation.
- 4. Write an explanatory sentence with an example for each item mentioned in your introductory sentence.
- 5. Add any details that might make your opinion clearer, and add a closing statement. A closing statement for the rainforest essay response might look like: These three things are the primary reasons for the disappearance of rain forests.
- 6. <u>Read your response closely, checking and correcting any spelling, punctuation and grammatical errors.</u>
